10th Anniversary Bellingham Chamber Chorale

Now in its tenth anniversary season after being founded by Tim Fitzpatrick, the Bellingham Chamber Chorale has performed regularly and attracted a diverse audience and strong support from around northwestern Washington State. The BCC has maintained a high level of quality, drawing on the most skilled singers in the area, including WWU faculty and staff, students, and alumni, local voice teachers, and fine singers from all over Whatcom and Skagit counties. The Chorale has sung diverse choral repertoire from the Renaissance to the twentieth century, including motets of Bach, Handel's Messiah, Brahm's Requiem, Rachmaninov's Vespers, Britten's Ceremony of Carols, John Corrigliano's Fern Hill, and concerts of opera and Broadway hits. The BCC maintains a relatively small core of 35-40 singers and once seasonally expands to accommodate larger choral works.



Ryan Smit Artistic Director

Ryan Smit is in his second season as Artistic Director of the Bellingham Chamber Chorale. He was first a singer in the ensemble, then an assistant conductor, and in 2010-2011 served as guest artistic director. He has taught 7-12 choir, general music, and music theory at Lynden Christian

School since 2005. Under his direction, the LCHS Concert Choir was recently invited to sing in Carnegie Hall in a massed choir performance of Beethoven's Mass in C major with John Rutter. He is an active member of Male Ensemble Northwest, a group comprised of choral teachers and professors who perform and host workshops for young male singers throughout the northwest. He has served as chorusmaster for the Skagit Opera's production of Madame Butterfly. He is the director of the senior choir at Third Christian Reformed Church in Lynden. He also teaches private voice during the summer, serves community choirs and student musicians as a vocal clinician, and performs as a tenor soloist with the Lynden Choral Society.

Previously, Ryan taught choir, music theory, and guitar at Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale, Arizona, where he also served as Music Director at Phoenix Christian Reformed Church and sang tenor professionally with Charles Bruffy and the two-time Grammy award-winning Phoenix Chorale for six years. He received his undergraduate degree in Choral and Instrumental Music Education from Dordt College (Sioux Center, IA) and a master's degree in Choral Music Education from Arizona State University (Tempe, AZ). Ryan lives in Lynden with his wife Amie and two children, Caleb and Emilyn.
